SUBJECT: Measure M Eligibility Requirements
Resolution of Status of Circulation Element

BACKGROUND

Each year Cities are required to submit to the Orange County Transportation Agency certain information regarding the maintenance and status of City streets and transportation elements. This information is required in order to maintain eligibility to receive Measure M funds. One of the information items required is a resolution concerning the status of the City's Circulation Element and Master Plan of Arterial Highways.

FINDINGS

The following findings are required to be made regarding the City Circulation Element and the County Master Plan of Arterial Highways.

- a) The arterial highway portion of the City Circulation Element of the City is in conformance with the County Master Plan of Arterial Highways;
- b) The City attests that no unilateral reduction in through lanes has been made on any MPAH arterials during Fiscal Year 2001-02;
- c) The City has adopted a uniform setback ordinance providing for the preservation of rights-of-way consistent with the MPAH arterial highway classifications and;
- d) The City has adopted provisions for the limitation of access to arterial highways in order to protect the integrity of the system.

FISCAL IMPACT

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt Resolution 2002-2610, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Villa Park concerning the status of the Circulation Element for the City of Villa Park.
