GENERAL NOTES

1. Trees shall be selected from the Master List of Trees. The list is subject to change based on approval by the city Council.
2. Trees shall not be planted so as to restrict sight distances below the minimums set forth in Exhibit B of Ordinance No. 81-
3. Minimum distance between trees shall be in accordance with the spacing requirements set forth in the Master List of Trees.
4. Trees shall not be planted less than four (4) feet from any walkway connection or building entrance.
5. Tree wells shall be as specified by the City Engineer.
6. Trees planted in tree wells shall be installed per the approval of the Street Superintendent and in accordance with the Master List of Trees.
7. Tree wells permitted only in areas where full parkway sidewalk is in compliance with City standards.
8. No tree shall be planted under utility lines that does not lend itself to top pruning; i.e. pines, palms and cedars.
9. No tree shall be planted within a roadway median or tree well that does not lend itself to lateral pruning to conform with Exhibit B of Ordinance No. 81-
